Dear Senator Singh,

On behalf of the Lansing Regional Chamber of Commerce (LRCC) and our more than 1,000 member businesses across the region, I write to express our opposition to **Senate Bill 134**.

This bill would significantly hinder Michigan's business climate by introducing duplicative regulations in industries already subject to comprehensive oversight through existing state licensing boards. SB 134 opens the door to increased legal liability and confusion for job providers that are following current regulations and acting in good faith.

The LRCC has consistently opposed this legislation in prior sessions, and our concerns remain unchanged. Employers, especially small businesses, are already facing steep challenges—including workforce shortages, inflation, and rising operating costs. Adding regulatory and legal uncertainty into this environment threatens our ability to retain jobs, create new ones, and invest in our communities.

Michigan should be enacting policies that support entrepreneurs and innovators—not policies that place unnecessary barriers in their way. We respectfully urge you to vote **NO** on SB 134 to protect Michigan's economic competitiveness and our small business community.
